The European University Sports Association (EUSA) is an umbrella organization that comprises National University Sports Associations (NUSA) from 47 European countries, providing sporting activities, educational events, and expertise in policy making and programming. ANTI-DOPING



Doping is not a guarantee of success in sport. In fact, its effect is usually the opposite. A lot of elite sportsmen and sportswomen who did doping got caught. As a result, they lost pride and were banned for at least 2 years from participating in a sport they loved and lived for. An even bigger problem of doping are the effects on the body.

In elite sports, doping is defined as a violation of one or more anti-doping rules:

- 1. Presence of a prohibited substance in an athlete's sample
- 2. Use or attempted use of a prohibited substance or method
- 3. Refusing to submit sample collection after being notified
- 4. Failure to file athlete whereabouts information & missed tests
- 5. Tampering with any part of the doping control process
- 6. Possession of a prohibited substance or method
- 7. Trafficking a prohibited substance or method
- 8. Administering or attempting to administer a prohibited substance or method to an athlete

You can find the list of prohibited substances and methods on the internet, as it is updated every year by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and it's valid for every sport.

ANTI-DOPING

EUSA is active in Anti-Doping promotion, and has been a partner in the European Anti-Doping Initiative (EADIn) and Match point, supporting European-wide Anti-Doping mentality in the youth sector by establishing a moral tenor towards concepts such as Fair-play, sensitizing and raising awareness on all levels of the complex social environment surrounding the doping problematic, and implementing strategies to motivate young people to pass on the message and create a strong multiplying effect. Also, the International University Sport Federation (FISU) has been actively promoting sports without drugs, also at the university sports level.

EUSA is currently not enforcing doping tests at our events. In accordance with the national legislation of the host countries, however, doping controls may be implemented by the National Anti-Doping Agencies. If such doping tests are executed, the WADA rules and regulations are applicable to all athletes. Please remember that testing can be conducted in-competition and out-of-competition. If you are identified in a Registered Testing Pool (RTP), you must provide current and accurate whereabouts information.

What can you do to be an excellent athlete?

- Practice right and live healthy
- Get more information about the consequences of Doping
- Play fair and be a good role model to younger athletes
- Be committed to sport without doping Doping? No, thanks!

FAIR - PLAY

Fair play is a core value of EUSA, deeply embedded in our mission and activities. In partnership with the European Fair Play Movement (EFPM), we actively promote sportsmanship, respect, and solidarity at all our events. For over 20 years, EUSA has championed these values, recognising fair play as the true essence of sport.

Fair play is present in sports as the unwritten rule, a moral value that represents the real essence of sport. It represents that opponents must be appreciated and in nowadays practising of sports, more than ever, it is vitally important to defend the values intrinsic to sport: respect for oneself and others, solidarity, and fair play.

Since 2007, EUSA has honoured outstanding acts of fair play with the Enno Harms Fair Play Award, named after the first EUSA President and a strong advocate for fair play. At each event, organisers, delegates, and participants commit to upholding fair play, with the oath of respect and integrity declared during the opening ceremonies.

The prestigious annual EUSA Enno Harms Fair Play Award is awarded to athletes demonstrating fair play during the matches, following the rules, and pursuing a "clean" game, and is awarded with a fair play recognition already during the event. EUSA Executive Committee members discuss the proposals received from all sporting events governed by EUSA in that year and select the team or individual to receive the Enno Harms Fair Play award, which is formally handed to them at a special occasion, usually at the EUSA Gala.

Fair play will remain a key focus at the European Universities Championships 2025.

Guided by EUSA's principles and the Olympic spirit, our events promote respect, equality, and non-discrimination, contributing to a more inclusive and peaceful society through sport.

We kindly invite all delegations to submit proposals for the Enno Harms Fair Play Award, recognising individuals or university teams who have demonstrated exemplary behaviour, integrity, and sportsmanship during the Championships.

EUSA INCIDENT POLICY

One of the Fundamental Principles of Olympism is that "practice of sport is a human right" and that "every individual must have the possibility of practising sport, without discrimination of any kind". This principle further states that this requires a behaviour based on "mutual understanding with a spirit of friendship, solidarity and fair play".

EUSA considers sports as an active tool in the education of university students and aims at encouraging and supporting "the promotion of ethics, Fair Play, gender equity and good governance in sport" (EUSA Statutes).

With the EUSA Incident Policy, EUSA clarifies the expectations and consequences regarding the behaviour of different stakeholders at EUSA's events to allow the creation of a safe and enjoyable environment.

Bydgoszcz is a city in northern Poland, straddling the meeting of the Vistula with its left-bank tributary, the Brda. With a city population of 344,091 and an urban agglomeration with more than 470,000 inhabitants, Bydgoszcz is the eighth-largest city in Poland. The city is part of the Bydgoszcz—Toruń metropolitan area, which totals over 850,000 inhabitants. Bydgoszcz is the seat of Kazimierz Wielki University, University of Science and Technology as well as the Medical College of Nicolaus Copernicus University in Toruń. It also hosts the Pomeranian Philharmonic concert hall, the Opera Nova opera house, and Bydgoszcz Airport. Being between the Vistula and Oder rivers, and by the Bydgoszcz Canal, the city is connected via the Noteć, Warta, Elbe and German canals with the Rhine, a river linked to the Mediterranean and Black Seas by canals and flowing into the North Sea. Bydgoszcz is an architecturally rich city, with gothic, neo-gothic, neo-baroque, neoclassicist, modernist and Art Nouveau styles present, for which it earned a nickname Little Berlin. The notable granaries on Mill Island and along the riverside belong to one of the most recognized timber-framed landmarks in Poland.



The Republic of Poland is a country located in Central Europe, bordered by Germany to the west; the Czech Republic and Slovakia to the south; Ukraine and Belarus to the east; and the Baltic Sea. The total area of Poland is 312,679 square kilometers (120,726 sq mi). With a population of over 38.5 million people, Poland is a member of the European Union and Schengen Area.

Poland is a country of representative democracy and according to the Global Peace Index ranks in the top 20 percent of the most peaceful countries in the world. President, elected by popular vote every five years, is the head of the country. Prime minister, elected every four years, is the head of government. In 1999 Poland was divided into 16 voivodeships, 380 poviats, and 2478 communes.

Polish University Sports Association

(AZS - Akademicki Zwiazek Sportowy) is the biggest sports students organization in Poland, that exists from the beginning of the 20th century. The AZS as the association was established in 1909 in Krakow and from there spread to all academic centers across the country. Because of believing in universal values, the AZS has survived all political circumstances, that Poland witnessed in last one hundred years. That is why AZS history is so great and successful and the association is nowadays the biggest students organization in Poland.

At present the AZS has more than 42 000 members, associated in more than 250 clubs, that trains in about 3 000 sections. AZS has many supporters thanks to the universal values, such as: love of sport, promotion of healthy and active lifestyle. For their members sport is not only about muscles and medals. In the first place it is a passion to achieve goals, that seem to be impossible. That is why the AZS has its Senior Clubs, which could be a great example to follow.

The AZS is based on a Statute, which includes its main purposes such as: promotion of volunteering, national identify and European integration, actions for handicapped and against pathologies or addictions.

The association also encourage to take responsibility for the local environment. The AZS is an active member of International University Sports Federation (FISU) and European University Sports Association (EUSA) since their creation and takes part in system of international competition.





September in Poland is still a comfortable month when it comes to weather. An average temperature is between 19°C (66°F) to 9°C (48°F).

On average in Bydgoszcz, in September, it is raining for 8 days, with typically 44 mm (1.73") of accumulated precipitation.

An average chance of rain is 27%. The chance of a windy day is 3%, and a sunny day is 37%. There is a 43% chance of the day being foggy, and 10% of being cloudy. No snow is expected.

The sunrise of the month in Bydgoszcz is between 05:47-06:35 and the sunset is between 18:16-19:24 CEST.

The average length of the day in September in Warsaw is 12 h and 40 min.

The average daily maximum UV index in September, in Poland, is 4; Namely, a medium hazard to health from exposure to Sun's UV rays. Take precautions - Protection against sunburn is recommended.





CATERING

On September 18 lunch will be served at the regatta course from 12:30 till 2:30 pm. The dinner after the Opening Ceremony takes place in Rother's Mills - next to the Opening Ceremony venue - just after the official opening.

All participants must wear their accreditation cards and have the catering vouchers in order to access the catering tent for meals.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

The OC provide medical service for all participants of the event. The Medical Services will be available throughout the Championship. The OC has also a contract with Antoni Jurasz University Hospital No.1 — distance between the competition venue and the hospital is 8 km. The hospital and various medical centers are all equipped with advanced technologies and professionals who will provide health assistance to the participants. All the EUSA Family members and participants will be provided with sufficient medical assistance during the event.

The head of delegation should inform the OC about athletes who suffer from chronic diseases such as diabetes, heart problems etc. and any allergy to drugs that are life-threatening.



PROTOCOL

General Technical Meeting

GTM is planned to take place on September 18th at 14:00 at 7 Kaliskiego Avenue - Hall B Auditorium Novum. The presence of the Heads of the delegations or delegations' representatives is mandatory. Maximum 2 people from one delegation can attend the GTM.

Medal Ceremonies

The two medal ceremonies take place on the September 21st. The first one starts after the morning finals, the second one after all the scheduled races. All participants at the ceremonies are required to face the flags while they are being raised and the EUSA Anthem is being played. The medalists are expected to attend the ceremony in the uniforms they wore at the opening ceremony, but are also allowed to attend wearing sports uniform when the ceremony takes place immediately after the sport event. The medalists are not allowed to take their national flag or any other national, cultural or religious symbol on the podium, and are expected to take off caps and sunglasses when receiving the medal – kept in hand throughout the ceremony. Medalists must remain at disposal of the media representatives after the medal ceremony.

Opening Ceremony

The Opening Ceremony takes place on September 18th at 5 p.m. at Mill Island (Bydgoszcz City Center). The marching athletes and delegation officials must wear their official delegation uniform. During the march pass, the delegations will carry the placard with the name of the University. The volunteers will carry the country flag. One English-speaking athlete will pronounce the oath during the opening ceremony. The delegations will come to the Opening Ceremony with their team attachés who will show them the way. After the cultural program, the dinner for all participants will take place at Rother's Mills, next to the Mill Island.

Closing Ceremony

Closing Ceremony takes place at the Brdyujscie Regatta Course, right after the last medal ceremony. The athletes and delegation officials must wear their official delegation uniform. The volunteers will carry the flags and one representative from the team will carry the placard with their university name. After the ceremony, the official farewell party is planned.

Only the Head of the Delegation is required to attend accreditation and must bring all the necessary documents. A full list of required documents can be found in the **EUSA Regulations**, REG 90, page 12. During accreditation, return travel plans will also be checked. Team Managers will be requested to review their crew entries. In case of any changes in the crew's composition, seating order, or the spelling of names, they must complete the Crew Change Form and submit it to the Organising Committee at the Accreditation Center or send it by email to przemyslaw@knigawka.pl and rowing2025@eusa.eu

The accreditation office working hours:

September 17: 10:00 - 21:00

If a delegation arrives by car during working hours of the accreditation office, they should go to the competition venue first. If they arrive later, they should go to the accommodation venue and will receive their accreditation cards the next day.

If a delegation has not paid the EUSA Fee — it will be collected by the EUSA Staff Member in cash (EUR) during the accreditation.

If a delegation has not paid the Participation Fee/Boat Rental Fee - it will be collected by the Member of the OC by card (EUR) during the accreditation.

BOAT RENTAL

Boats should be collected after the accreditation. During the accreditation process, a deposit of 100 EUR per boat must be paid in cash. At the time of collection, the rules and regulations of the boat rental must be signed.

The deposit will be refunded when the boat is returned and inspected. In case of damage to the boat or oars, the deposit will not be returned and will serve as the insurance deductible.

Boats and oars should be returned after the last race.

COXSWAIN

The coxswain shall be registered in the system as an athlete. The coxswain is considered an integral part of the team and, therefore, must meet the same eligibility requirements and criteria as all other athletes.

WEIGH-IN

The weighing of both boats and athletes will be open during the regatta course operating hours starting Thursday, 18 September. Boat weighing will take place in the boathouse No. 1. All weighings will be conducted in accordance with World Rowing regulations.

BOAT NUMBERS

To collect boat numbers, a deposit of €5 per boat, payable in cash, is required.

WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals must be announced in writing to EUSA and the Organizing Committee **no later than 48 hours before the General Technical Meeting (GTM)** and sent by email to rowing2025@eusa.eu. Start lists will also be checked during accreditation.
